Duties and Responsibilities

The Research Coordinator reports to the ACCHO Director. Primary duties and responsibilities include:

- 1. Providing leadership for the development of ACCHO's research portfolio
- 2. Leading the development of research proposals for ACCHO
- Establishing research partnerships with community organizations, community members, academic researchers and other stakeholders involved or interested in HIV/AIDS research initiatives
- 4. Overseeing the implementation of research activities
- 5. Managing and analyzing research data, and ensure quality assurance
- 6. Monitoring ACCHO's research budget
- 7. Promoting ACCHO's research activities at different forums and events, and through ongoing community-based dissemination activities
- 8. Representing ACCHO in research partnerships and collaborations with community organizations, community members, academic researchers and other stakeholders involved or interested in HIV/AIDS research initiatives
- 9. Coordinating the development and implementation of mechanisms to promote community involvement in and awareness of research

Qualifications

Preferred applicants will have:

- 1. A university degree (preferably a Master's) is required, preferably in health, social science or a related field
- 2. At least 2 years of related research experience, including:
 - a. Designing and implementing data collection protocols
 - b. Managing and analyzing qualitative and/or quantitative data Ability to

- c. Conducting literature reviews and environmental scans
- 3. Familiarity with trends in HIV/AIDS social and behavioural research
- 4. An understanding of the issues that impact the lives of diverse people living with and affected by HIV/AIDS, particularly African, Caribbean and Black communities in Canada
- 5. Knowledge of African, Caribbean and Black communities in Canada, and capacity to work with those communities
- 6. Commitment to an anti-oppression framework (anti-racist, pro-choice and anti-homophobia)
- 7. Proven analytical problem solving skills
- 8. Excellent project management skills
- 9. Strong written and oral communication skills
- 10. Proficiency with applications for analyzing research data (e.g., SPSS, NVivo, etc.)
- 11. Proficiency with standard Microsoft office software (e.g., Word, PowerPoint, Excel, etc.)
- 12. Ability to work independently, be self-directed and function effectively in a team environment
- 13. Ability to work with diverse communities

The ability to communicate in English and French is an asset.
