The successful applicant will be responsible for promoting, building and supporting the OHTN's Indigenous research initiatives. As an organization, the OHTN strives for excellence in all we do. Responsibilities

- Support the newly established OHTN Indigenous Research Steering Committee
- Foster relationships with Indigenous researchers, front-line agencies and service providers, and Indigenous people with or at risk of HIV
- Work with Indigenous communities and researchers to identify/develop research priorities
- Conduct literature reviews to identify effective Indigenous health and wellness interventions that could be adapted in Ontario to enhance HIV prevention, engagement and care
- Work with all OHTN programs and units to build capacity in Indigenous HIV research and develop relevant research projects and initiatives
- Work with the Director of the Applied Epidemiology Unit at the OHTN to develop regular updates on HIV and Indigenous people in Ontario.

Requirements

- At least a master's level degree in Aboriginal studies, interdisciplinary studies or a discipline closely related to the experience of Indigenous people in Ontario and Canada, or equivalent work experience.
- Experience working with Indigenous communities, and knowledge of Indigenous and decolonizing research methodologies
- Experience with HIV research and cross-disciplinary research an asset
- Knowledge of the community-based HIV sector in Ontario an asset
- Superior written and verbal communication skills, including experience writing research proposals
- Superior organizational skills, and demonstrated ability to manage people and projects
- Experience using databases.

The OHTN is seeking a team player who enjoys working both collaboratively and independently, is comfortable with the pressures of a fast-paced environment, works well with shifting priorities, and is adept at juggling competing demands.
