ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW

The Ontario HIV Treatment Network (OHTN), established in 1998, is an innovative, not-for-profit organization that supports and conducts high quality research to help end the HIV epidemic, and shares the best available evidence with all those who can put that knowledge into action.

The OHTN conducts and funds HIV research and provides education, capacity building, evaluation services, data collection and monitoring for HIV services in Ontario. It is a collaborative network of: people with HIV, community-based agencies, health care providers, government policy makers, educators, and researchers. With over 50 staff, the OHTN is an active, committed partner in Ontario's HIV/AIDS strategy.

THE ROLE

The position is responsible for planning, coordinating and implementing of all activities and projects related to the Ontario Community HIV/AIDS Reporting Tool (OCHART), the system that organizations funded by the AIDS Bureau of the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care use to report on their activities and on client needs. Reporting to the Manager of the Evidence-based Practice Unit (EBPU), the position works collaboratively with community agencies, OHTN research analysts, OHTN web designers and writers, the IT team and the AIDS Bureau. The OCHART coordinator creates and sustains a supportive and collaborative environment assisting agencies in submitting their data and assisting agencies and the AIDS Bureau in analyzing that data and using it to guide programs and services.

This high-profile and key role has wide-ranging coordination and hands-on responsibilities, including: working closely with the AIDS Bureau to continually develop the OCHART tool to meet the sector's reporting needs; maintaining the OCHART online platform; facilitating the bi-annual OCHART reporting process; providing agencies and programs with both initial and ongoing training to use OCHART; working with other EBPU staff to review and validate the data; developing reports from the data; responding to questions and queries; overseeing the preparation of an annual system-wide report (The View from the Front Lines); and planning and organizing an annual meeting with OCHART users to discuss the data and its implications for their programs and services.

The OCHART coordinator is expected to work with agencies in a collegial and supportive way to continually improve the quality of the data, and to enhance knowledge and understanding of Ontario's response to HIV and its impact.
