

## Section 6: Harm Reduction Services

This section will show you how to complete Section 6 of OCHART 2.0, Harm Reduction Services. This section is for any organization or program that provides harm reduction services for clients who use substances.

Remember, you can fill in any OCHART section on your computer, tablet, or smart phone.

Type "www.ochart.ca" into the address bar. Press "ENTER".

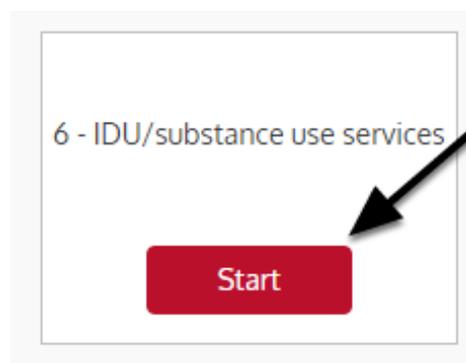
