The **OCS** is a long-term, **community-governed** research project that collects health and social data from people living with HIV to improve health and care outcomes in the province.

The **OCS Governance Committee (GC)** is comprised primarily of people living with HIV, alongside **scientists, clinicians**, and other **community interest holders**.

The GC **oversees** policies, **reviews** research proposals, **advises** on standards and strategies and **supports** knowledge sharing across Ontario's HIV community.

The committee meets quarterly via teleconference, with one in-person meeting held annually.
